

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN ALASKA

- **Voter ID.** BRING ID. To cast a regular ballot you need to bring your signed voter ID card issued by Alaska or other signed ID such as valid photo identification, birth certificate, passport, hunting and fishing license or senior citizen card. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote with a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** If you move within the same municipality or to another municipality, you must cancel your former registration and register at your new address. This may be done on Election Day.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear clothes or accessories that contain references to the candidates, parties or political slogans when you go to vote.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 200 feet of the polling place.
