

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN GEORGIA

- **Voter ID.** BRING PHOTO ID. You must provide a photo ID before you will be allowed to vote. Acceptable forms include a Georgia driver's license (even if expired), any government-issued photo ID, a valid U.S. passport, a U.S. military ID or a valid tribal ID. If you do not have a photo ID, you will be permitted to vote with a provisional ballot.
- **Change of residence.** If you have not registered at your new address, you can still vote in your old polling place if you moved within the same county or you moved to a different county within 30 days before the election.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear campaign materials when you vote. Georgia law prohibits wearing campaign buttons, signs, pins, stickers, T-shirts, etc., within 150 feet of the polling place. You will be forced to remove or cover any campaign material before being allowed to vote.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed 150 feet from the building or 25 feet from voters waiting in line (if further than 150 feet from the building).
