

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN MAINE

- **Voter ID.** BRING ID if you are a first-time voter who registered by mail and did not provide ID verification with your registration application. You may bring a Maine driver's license, a current utility bill, a bank statement or paycheck. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote with a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** If you moved within the same municipality, you may be required to register before voting. You may register on the day of the election if you bring your Maine driver's license and proof of your place of residence, such as a utility bill. The same applies to those who move from one municipality to another. A registered voter who moves to another state within 30 days of a presidential election may not be removed from the voting list and may cast a ballot in the presidential election in person in Maine or by absentee ballot.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear any clothes or accessories that contain references to the candidates or parties within 250 feet of the poll. Maine law permits you to wear buttons that do not exceed three inches at the longest dimension.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 250 feet of the polling place.
