

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN MISSISSIPPI

- **Voter ID. BRING ID.** You may provide a Mississippi driver's license. Also, as long as it lists your name and address, you may provide a government check or a paycheck. If you do not or could not bring ID, you may vote by affidavit ballot. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote with a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** If you move within the same county within the 30 days leading up to the election, you may provide an affidavit and vote in your new place of residence. A voter who moves from an election precinct in one county to an election precinct in another county must register in the new county of residence to be permitted to vote. However, you may vote with a provisional ballot.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear any clothes or accessories that contain references to the candidates or parties when within 150 feet of the poll. Such conduct is prohibited by Mississippi law. If you wear clothing that contains such words or pictures on it, you may remove or cover it up before approaching the 150-foot perimeter of the poll.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 150 feet of the polling place.
