

# YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN NEVADA

- **Voter ID.** BRING ID. It is always a good idea to have a photo ID when voting. But you must have ID if you are registering on Election Day or you registered by mail and have not already provided ID. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote with a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** If you moved to Nevada from another state within 30 days before the election, you can apply for a ballot and vote at the office of the county clerk in your county. If you moved within the same county in Nevada and did not update your registration by Oct. 14, you can vote at your previous polling place.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear campaign materials. While voting, you cannot wear any badge, button or other insignia designed to promote any political party, candidate or ballot question. You cannot be prevented from voting if you are unable to remove or cover the political material. However, violation of this law is a gross misdemeanor, punishable by incarceration for up to one year and a fine of \$2,500.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 100 feet of the polling place.
