

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN WASHINGTON

- **Voter ID.** BRING PHOTO ID. You must provide ID before you will be allowed to vote. Acceptable forms include a driver's license, military ID, utility bill, student ID, bank statement, paycheck or other government document that contains your name and address.
- **Change of residence.** If you were registered to vote at your last residence, and you moved within the same county, you can update your registration on Election Day.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear campaign materials. To avoid unnecessary delay, make sure you can easily cover or remove any clothing, button, sticker, etc., that supports a candidate or political party. You may not be allowed to vote until such materials are removed or covered.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 300 feet of the polling place.
