IN NEW JERSEY, WE'RE ALWAYS ON!

With political campaigning taking a year off in all but three states this year, much of the attention of the labor movement nationwide turned to New Jersey to see what impact labor can have on politics in an off-year election.

From offering endorsements to candidates running for all 120 seats of the New Jersey Legislature, to preparing 51 rank-and-file union members for the rigors of a political campaign, to educating union voters about the importance of the 2007 elections, the LABOR 2007 program picked up right where the LABOR 2006 program, largely responsible for Senator Robert Menendez' overwhelming victory, left off.

The grassroots efforts of more than 10,000 trade unionists turned an otherwise cold and rainy day into one of great achievement for the labor movement. And once again, the time and energy our affiliated unions and local members contributed during this campaign proved to be the decisive factor in the election of 33 labor candidates as well as a majority of our endorsed legislative candidates. This electoral success is vital to our ability to continue to advocate for pro-working family policies at the local, county and state level.

Thanks to the efforts of everyone involved in the Labor 2007 program, the voices of working families are stronger than ever in the halls of government statewide. New Jersey continues to lead the way in the total number of rank-and-file union members serving in public office. These elected officials share our desire to make New Jersey an even better place for workers and will continue to advocate for policies such as paid family leave and real health care reform.
