✓ **Creates Jobs.** As a state senator and former Tempe mayor, Harry Mitchell has created jobs, increased mass transportation efforts and made Arizona's neighborhoods safer. (www.harry2006.com)

J.D. HAYWORTH HAS FAILED WORKING FAMILIES

■ **Cut Billions from Health and Education.** Hayworth voted to slash funding for student loans, Medicare, Medicaid, child support enforcement, agricultural programs and local employers hurt by unfair trade agreements. (S. 1932, Vote #670, 12/19/05)

■ **Sends Our Jobs Overseas.** Hayworth supports unfair trade agreements like the Central America Free Trade Agreement that send good American jobs overseas and weaken worker protections. (H.R. 3045, Vote #443, 7/28/05; H.R. 2739, 7/24/03; H.R. 2738, 7/24/03)

■ **Cut Overtime Pay.** Hayworth voted to deny up to 8 million workers overtime pay when they work more than 40 hours a week. (H.R. 2660, Roll Call #351, 7/10/03)

J.D. Hayworth has earned a lifetime record of voting **wrong** on working family issues 92 percent of the time. (AFL-CIO Congressional Voting Record)
