CHRIS MURPHY WILL FIGHT FOR WORKING FAMILIES

✓ **Lowered Prescription Drug Costs.** Chris Murphy led the fight to expand ConnPACE, the state's prescription drug assistance program, and will work to fix the flawed Medicare program so that prescriptions are affordable. (S.B. 45, 3/4/05)

✓ **Protects Our Jobs.** Chris Murphy voted to require employers to notify workers 120 in advance if they plan to outsource their jobs. He voted twice for a bill that limited the state's ability to privatize services, which the governor vetoed. (S.B. 358, 2005; S.B. 94, 2005; S.B. 2101, 2005)

✓ **Supports Collective Bargaining Rights.** Chris Murphy voted to restore collective bargaining and binding arbitration to city employees in Waterbury. (S.B. 20, 2006)

NANCY JOHNSON SUPPORTS THE BUSH AGENDA, NOT WORKING FAMILIES

■ **Increased Health Care Costs.** Nancy Johnson voted to increase working families' health care premiums. She received more than \$800,000 from the health care industry when she authored the failed Medicare Part D program. (NBC News, 7/3/06; *The Hill*, 4/4/06; www.opensecrets.org)

■ **Sent Our Jobs Overseas.** Nancy Johnson voted to send our jobs overseas with CAFTA and voted for a bill that provided \$40 billion in tax breaks for companies that export jobs. She also voted to privatize hundreds of thousands of federal jobs and against funding for critical job-training programs, against unemployment benefits and against protecting overtime pay. ■ **Opposed Our Freedom to Form Unions.** Nancy Johnson opposes our freedom to form unions free from employer intimidation. (H.R. 1696, 7/22/05)
