**Increased Costs of Our Health Care.**

Anne Northup voted to increase insurance premiums for working families and voted for health care saving accounts that shift costs—and risks—onto workers. (H.R. 525, Vote #426, 7/26/05; [Louisville] *Courier-Journal*, 5/18/06)

**Consistently Failed Workers.** Anne Northup

voted against critical job training programs, against protecting overtime pay and against raising the minimum wage. (H.R. 27, Vote #48, 3/2/05; H.R. 2660, 7/10/03; H.R. 3846, Votes #43, #45, 3/9/00)

**Raided Social Security Trust Fund.**

Anne Northup voted to raid \$1.1 trillion from the Social Security Trust Fund. She supports privatizing Social Security. (H.C.R. 95, Vote #88, 3/17/05; [Louisville] *Courier-Journal*, 6/26/05)

Anne Northup has a lifetime AFL-CIO Congressional Voting Record of voting **wrong** on working family issues 92 percent of the time.
