## LABOR-ENDORSED



### **TED STRICKLAND** FOR GOVERNOR

■ **Protects Our Pensions.**

Ted Strickland introduced a pension reform bill to help families save for a more secure retirement because the current system leaves too many workers without pensions and doesn't safeguard the plans of those workers who have them. "It is unacceptable to me to have southern Ohioans work their whole lives without being able to afford a comfortable retirement." (*Columbus Dispatch*, 3/30/97)

■ **Advocates for Our Health Care.**

Ted Strickland authored the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) legislation, a federal initiative that now provides health insurance for millions of children. (*Health Law Week*, 3/1/02)

■ **Protects Our Jobs.** Ted Strickland voted against sending our jobs overseas with CAFTA and to protect federal jobs from privatization. He introduced a bill encouraging companies to keep call center jobs here in the United States. (H.R. 3045, Vote #443, 7/28/05; H.R. 3058, Vote #357, 6/30/05)



### **SHERROD BROWN** FOR U.S. SENATE

■ **Protects Our Pensions.** Sherrod

Brown co-sponsored a bill to ensure that retired steel workers and their families would get health insurance and prescription drug benefits. "We must protect the hundreds of thousands of hard-working families who rely on this industry for salaries, pensions and health benefits. Anything less is unacceptable." (*Associated Press*, 5/2/02)

■ **Leads on Health Care.** Sherrod Brown fought for affordable prescription drugs and sponsored the Children's Health Act of 2000. He was named the Distinguished Public Health Legislator of the Year in 2002. (<http://sherrod.house.gov/bio.htm>; *American Public Health Association*)

■ **Fights for Our Jobs.** Sherrod Brown led the fight against sending our jobs overseas with bad trade deals like CAFTA. He created a fair trade plan that protects workers' rights and standards while supporting small businesses, family farmers and ranchers. (H.R. 3045, Vote #443, 7/28/05; H.R. 3058, Vote #357, 6/30/05; *Myths of Free Trade*, 2004)
