

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN MINNESOTA

- **Voter ID.** BRING ID. It is always a good idea to have a photo ID when voting. You must have ID if you are registering on Election Day or you registered by mail and have not already provided ID. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote with a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** As long as you have lived in Minnesota for 20 days, you can register or update your registration and vote at your current polling place on Election Day.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** Minnesota law prohibits anyone from wearing political badges, political buttons, T-shirts, etc., within 100 feet of the polling place on Election Day. You will be forced to remove or cover any campaign material before being allowed to vote. You may also be fined up to \$300 for violating this law.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 100 feet of the polling place.
