

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN NEW JERSEY

- **Voter ID.** BRING ID if you did not already provide identification to the county commissioner of registration or in case the identification information could not be verified (i.e., your driver's license number or the last four digits of your Social Security number). You may provide your driver's license, student or job ID, military or other government ID, store membership ID, U.S. passport or a government check. If you do not show identification, you may vote by provisional ballot. If you registered to vote by mail and have not previously voted in a federal election, you must show current and valid photo identification or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You have the right to vote with a provisional ballot if you cannot present valid ID.
- **Change of residence.** You may vote by regular ballot if you registered to vote on or before the 21st day preceding the election. If you moved within the same county, you will be permitted to vote in your previous election district by provisional ballot upon signing an affidavit or "affirmation of residency form." If you move to a different county, you should register in your new county of residence on or before the 21st day prior to the election.
- **Clothing, buttons, caps and other accessories.** DO NOT wear any clothes or accessories that contain references to the candidates or parties when within 100 feet of the poll. Such conduct is prohibited by New Jersey law. If you wear clothing that contains such words or pictures on it, you may cover it up before approaching the 100-foot perimeter of the poll.
- **No-electioneering perimeter.** No electioneering is allowed within 100 feet of the polling place.
